Prominent people include Olympic speed skater Charlie Jewtraw, Prime family, Bennett family, Elles Family, Norton family, Byron Brewster, Bidney Brewster, Mrs. Melvil Dewey, Mrs. Elizabeth Newcomb

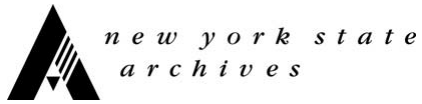
