The History Museum opened on Saturday, May 25 with new additions in all three galleries. The Lake Placid History exhibit


in the Mary MacKenzie Gallery has been expanded with two completely new additions, "Houses of Worship" and "School Days." The early transportation exhibit

Throughout the Museum you will find more objects on display and many interesting stories about our history and earlier residents of Lake Placid. Come visit us and bring your friends and family!







Bev's Bits- North Elba Cemeteries

A report from the Town Historian, Beverley P. Reid

The 1995 NY State Cemeteries Survey Project states that North Elba has five cemeteries. Two of these are dormant and have not been used since the late 1800's. The first one is called "Avery Family Cemetery" and is located on Averyville Road, the second is "Hinckley Family Cemetery" and is located behind Heaven Hill Farm on Bear Cub Road.

The oldest and largest of our cemeteries is the "North Elba Cemetery" located on Old Military Road. It was established in 1810 with the first burial being four-year-old Eunice Needham, daughter of Ruth and Jeremiah Needham. Meeting minutes show that a Committee was formed to secure funds \$500 from the Town budget to maintain and improve the property. Until 1961 acreage continued to be purchased from the Lake Placid Club to expand the cemetery. Early expense accounts show the digging of graves at \$3.50 each. Other expenses were for mowing and building of roads, etc.

St. Agnes Cemetery was established in 1909 on Cascade Road with property also purchased from the Lake Placid Club. Many volunteers maintained the cemetery and a Perpetual Fund for construction and maintenance was established by generous donations from the members of the parish. Several men volunteered for years for the upkeep of the cemetery. In 1961 a beautiful stone gateway was erected and paved roads established.

In 1917 1,000 pine trees were donated by the NY State Tree Conservation Nursery to the Lake Placid Women's Club which volunteers managed to plant 500 trees in each cemetery. These trees have prospered and provided needed shade and privacy through the years.

Until 1962 the Lake Placid Jewish community was served by the Tupper Lake Cemetery. However, at that time the "United Hebrew Community Cemetery" was constructed on Old Military Road under the leadership of Rabbi Guttman.

GALLERY SHOW OPENING

Echoes of Lake Placid's history are re-imaged for the modern day through artist Janet Millstein's unique multi-media printmaking. In *Imagined Reflections*, Millstein captures former residents, landscapes, and locations from Lake Placid's history and intersperses them into new original contexts. Shown side-by-side with the original historical photographs from the Lake Placid-North Elba Historical Society that inspired each work, this exhibit reflects our shared history in new and surprising ways.



Imagined Reflections opening reception is June 13, 5-7pm in the Gallery @ Lake Placid Center for the Arts (LPCA) 17 Algonquin Drive, Lake Placid. There is no admittance fee.
